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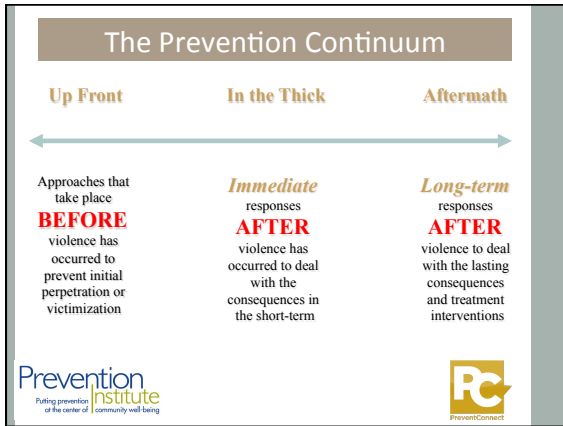


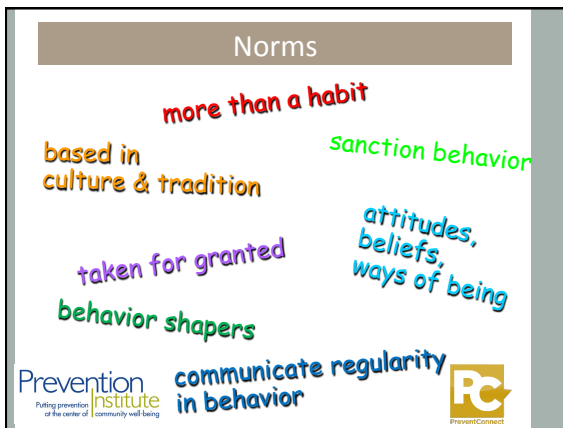
Prevention

Policy Example

- Policy itself can address problems that put communities at risk and help improve quality of life.
- Organizing a community to engage in the policy initiative can:
 1. Increase social networks and reduce isolation and alienation
 2. Give residents a sense of their own power and increase their ability to solve problems
 3. Strengthen individual members' sense of community

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
