






Grounding Beliefs


Strategies of State-Sanctioned Hate

- Erasing LGBTQ people from schools and public life.
- 2. Erecting systemic and structural barriers to make change harder.
- 3. Enshrining inequality.
- 4. Criminalizing and banning transition so transgender people can't be themselves.
- 5. Silencing supporters.

Good Friday morning!

The Ohio House of Representatives last week got some national media attention for passing a bill to keep transgender kids out of girls' sports. How? Simple. Anyone accused of being transgender would just have to present a doctor's note <u>indicating the student's sex based on</u>: Their internal and external sexual anatomy, their "normal endogenously produced levels of testosterone" and an "analysis of the participant's genetic makeup." It's that easy!



Impact: Increase in Sexual & Domestic Violence

Transgender teens with restricted bathroom access at higher risk of sexual assault

Transgender and gender-nonbinary teens face greater risk of sexual assault in schools that prevent them from using bathrooms or locker rooms consistent with their gender identity, according to a recent study.

Researchers looked at data from a survey of nearly 3,700 U.S. teens aged 13–17. The study found that 36% of transgender or gender–nonbinary students with restricted bathroom or locker room access reported being sexually assaulted in the last 12 months, according to a May 6, 2019 CNN article. Of all students surveyed, 1 out of every 4, or 25.9%, reported being a victim of sexual assault in the past year.

Bathroom policies:

- Take away safe spaces
- Encourage scrutiny and harassment



Impact: Misuse of anti-violence language

Greg Abbott said: "There is no doubt that these procedures are 'abuse' under Texas law, and thus must be halted. [DFPS] has a responsibility to act accordingly. I'll do everything I can to protect against those who take advantage of and harm young Texans."

Impact: Blocking Prevention Education

Impact: Increased trauma

- Survivors
 - Increase in trauma experiences and responses
 - Distrust of providers
 - Not able to access other services
 - Polyvictimization

- Staff:
 - Exhaustion
 - Distrust of others
 - Burnout
 - Disruption of work
 - Harassed or attacked
 - Organizations targeted



Impact: Access Denied

Anti-trans legislation impacts DV/SA services by:


- Defining "man" and "woman"
- Dictating who can be sheltered where
- Requiring use of legal names and sex from birth certificate
- Blocking staff training
- Challenging federal non-discrimination policies

Deep Equity

Intersectional

- Embodies the multiple identities that people hold and how they impact communities.
- Examines, race, class, age, and more.

Flexible

- Has room for both individual and community uniqueness.
- Can grow and change with people.



Example: Consent Education

May include discussions about

- Navigating what to share with partners
- Language to use with partners about bodies and sex
- Outness about being trans with other people.



Example: Bystander Intervention

- Include scenarios involving trans/nonbinary people.
- Discuss biases/beliefs that affect how people will show up for trans people.
- Include options for responses that are safe(r) and accessible for trans communities.




